"The world is as delicate and as complicated as a spider's web. If you touch one thread, you send shudders running through all the other threads," wrote Gerald Durrell, whose entertaining books continue to inspire many to explore the living world and uncover its marvellous secrets. Calling himself

an 'amateur naturalist,' Durrell, during his adventurous animal rescue journeys, witnessed firsthand the impact of human presence on the environment. He later added a bitter note to his spiderweb metaphor: "We are not just touching the web, we are tearing great holes in it."

At Planet Lens International Nature Photography and Film Festival, the screenings and exhibitions offer glimpses into unique situations and stories, told from a variety of perspectives. The camera lens zooms in on something special. And yet, behind the roots of a tree, the flow of a river or the movement of tiny creatures barely visible to the naked eye, the larger picture always begins to emerge: that on our majestic planet, everything is connected to everything else. Our atmosphere is shared. Our waters merge. A single touch sends tremors through all the threads. The natural environment is intertwined with the cultures of those who live within it. Plant diversity is linked to the number of pollinators. The shrinking of the wilderness is tied to the survival chances of its native species. Human activity is inseparable from climate change.

For a few days, Veszprém will become our eyes and our conscience: sharpening our vision, awakening our sense of responsibility. The works showcased at Planet Lens aim to both delight and unsettle. Through their lenses, we witness the irreplaceable treasures of our world – and the recklessness that puts them at risk. The human-inflicted scars on the landscape and the possible paths to healing. The wrongs we have committed against the Earth, but also the good we can still do for it.

If, while sitting in the screening room, wandering among the images or taking part in the accompanying events, we not only look but truly see, the experience can help us preserve this extraordinary and intricate world of ours in all its complex beauty. So that our touch as humans might not destroy and tear, but honour and heal.
