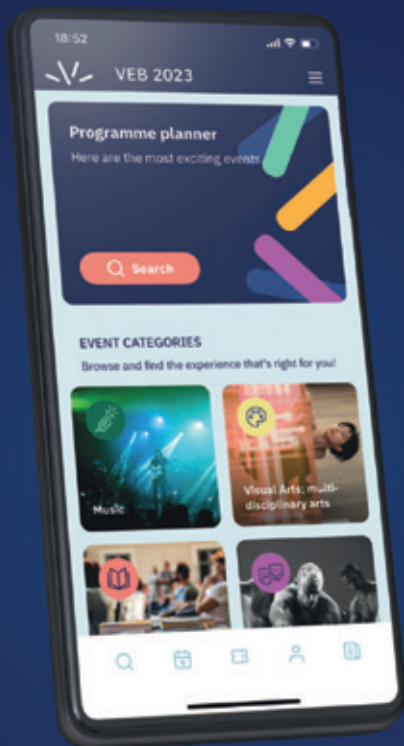

THE QUIETNESS OF EARLY MUSIC HAS MUCH TO OFFER TODAY'S PEOPLE



“Music close to silence”. This is how artistic director Pál Vikman describes the works that will be performed at the Veszprém Early Music Days between 17th and 26th July at the Jesuit Church of Veszprém Valley and on the 22nd and 27th and 28th July, at the Benedictine Abbey of Tihany.

The festival's unique atmosphere will evoke the period from the Middle Ages to the Classical period in Vienna, where music of the period will be performed with a smaller ensemble and on softer instruments. These genres do not thrive in large concert halls, but come to life in smaller chamber spaces, church acoustics or apartment concerts-spaces where the contact with the audience is much more direct.



The history of Veszprém Early Music Days goes back a decade. Lutenist Csaba Nagy first invited his fellow early musicians and the audience



to the music festival in 2013, which has been organised by the Orlando Ensemble for the past few years. Artistic director Pál Vikman says it's also a bit of a missionary activity to introduce people to early music.

“It takes a lot of research to get to grips with the way early music is performed, because the way music is written down has changed a lot over the centuries. Not to mention the instruments, some of which we only know from paintings and descriptions of the period. The historical performance movement is a complex work, since the “final product” is the result of a continuous collaboration between musicologist, performer and instrument maker.”

The experience of recent years has shown that the initiated performance of early music has a great impact on people today. It encourages the audience to slow down, pause, listen, contemplate, meditate if you like, almost regardless of musical literacy levels.

“We live in a noisy world, with so much information, sound and visual impact, so it's very difficult to get to the heart of things. In this world, what people need is silence, more subtle music born of nature, and a more generous use of time. It is good to experience the beauty of music that proclaims wholeness and the exquisiteness of the true acoustic sound,” the artistic director added.

Pál Vikman recommends:

- I warmly recommend the Kapsberger programme *Metamorphoses* by the founder of the festival, lutenist Csaba Nagy on 19th June.
- My personal favourite is the Spanish ensemble *Tasto Solo*, who this time will be performing a programme dedicated to Beatrix of Aragon, the Renaissance Queen of Hungary, in *Veszprém* on 20th, and their *Landini* concert entitled *Gentili spiriti* in *Tihany* on 22nd.
- I can't miss the concert by the French *Les Basses Reunies*, led by Bruno Cox, on 23rd, a real treat, a performance of Bach's *The Art of the Fugue*, this time on four viola da gambas and a harpsichord.
- The instrument *vihuela da mano* is known from contemporary descriptions and will be performed by world-famous soprano *María Cristina Kiehr*, tenor *Jonatan Alvarado* and lutenist *Ariel Abramovich* in a concert on 24th June
- The *Haydn Baryton Trio Budapest* will play for the first time in *Tihany* on 27th July and we have another first-time contribution by *Capella Savaria* on 21st July.



WINE JAZZ AND FUNK IN OLD TOWN SQUARE



10 days of free programmes at Rosé, Riesling and Jazz Days

From 7th to 16th July, for 10 days, delicious food and wine, jazz, blues, funk and many other discerning musical genres rendezvous with the festival-goers in Veszprém, in Old Town Square. The Rosé, Riesling and Jazz Days have been a recurring event for many years, and this year they will once again be held under the slogan “10 days, 30 winemakers, 30 concerts”.

The free-to-attend gastro-cultural event features three performers each day, while you can taste the specialities of the event’s gastronomic exhibitors.

The Rosé, Riesling and Jazz Days feature the leading wineries of the Balaton wine region, with a terroir approach. This year, Jásdi winery, Figula winery, St. Donat winery, Guden estate, and Káli Kövek winery, among others, will be present, but Slovenian wines will also be represented, and even Mionetto prosecco will be on offer.

In addition to the excellent wines, the vegan food trucks of Creative Kitchen and Pápai Ízek, the tapas & antipasti specialities of Oliva Restaurant and the snacks of Tihany cheese bistro promise an unforgettable gastronomic experience.

Hungarian artists will perform on the stage in Old Town Square, where you can enjoy 30 excellent concerts over 10 days. Soul and Emotion, Garami Funky Staff, Jumping Matt & His Combo, the trio of Tamás Berki & Péter Sári, áRON feat. Szakonyi Milán, GnS Horns formation, Swing-swing, Temesi Berci & Friends, Ruby Harlem and Biga Live.

Wine, music and the incomparable atmosphere of summer will be rounded off by the colourful works of art by the winners of the VeszprémFest My House-My Tower-My Town drawing competition, projected on the Fire Watchtower and City Hall.

FOUR DAYS OF MUSIC AT VESZPRÉM STREET MUSIC FESTIVAL

Competition for up and coming Hungarian musicians
and performances by international artists

More than twenty years ago, Veszprém Street Music Festival set itself the task of transforming Veszprém into the most colourful and friendly city in Europe for four days, while giving space and opportunities to international and Hungarian musicians who are not forced on us by radio stations and talent shows, but who impress the Veszprém audience with their openness and talent. A talent contest and concerts by international artists – this is what Veszprém Street Music Festival is all about. We have asked the organisers of our event to give you a sneak preview of the festival's programme from 19th to 22nd July.

Keanan Eksteen, by Noémi Árvai, booking

I was hunting for potential acts in the winter when I heard these two songs on a Spotify list: Dixie Clouds / Lost My Way. I was sure from the sound of it that it was South African, and if so, our South African contact must know it, and they did... He had just signed with their agency not long before, so it wasn't hard to get hold of him. The artist's name is Keanan Eksteen, and he plays old school rock 'n roll music with a youthful vibe, and on top of that he sounds a bit like George Ezra. I'm very curious about him.:

I first bumped into CQMD at a university festival in Bordeaux, where I was volunteering behind the bar in 1999(!). I read up on them and borrowed one of their records from the Bordeaux library (YouTube didn't exist back then). I wasn't convinced at first, I wondered what a brass band was doing at a progressive festival. Well, live, I understood. They tore up the tent and put on the best party of the night, even though there was competition in all styles. CQMD is the first French brass band to dare stand on stage like a rock band. It's also worth mentioning that CQMD is practically the only (or last?) funk band in France. I'm not a fan of the genre, but what they do with the banjo and the brass instruments is unbeatable.

The playlist had run out, I couldn't restart it with wet hands, so Spotify threw in something similar, a bit bluesy, a bit jazzy, a bit funky newer French. I was stunned. It was Charles Pasi. I wiped my hands, then listened to one of his albums, then another. I did some research and found out that the bloke had been a finalist in The International Blues Challenge 2006 in Memphis. "So I haven't made a mistake then," I thought. Based on his live recordings, not only is our protagonist brilliant, but so are his bandmates. You won't want to miss the encore at the end of the concert either, just sayin'! Seeing and hearing him, I felt we had to get him for the festival at some point. VESZPRÉMFESt TO CELEBRATE WITH WORLD STARS



Pop, soul, R&B, world music and opera at the 20th annual premium music festival

2023 is a special year in the history of VeszprémFest. It is special because the festival, with main sponsorship from Mol-New Europe Foundation, is proud to present its programmes to the public as a flagship event of the Veszprém-Balaton European Capital of Culture 2023 series, and it is also special because this year marks its 20th anniversary.

The jubilee VeszprémFest awaits the audience for 5 days on 2 stages, with one of the strongest programmes in its history between 12th and 17th July.

On 12th July, Alvaro Soler, one of today's most popular young Latin singers, opens the programme in História Kert. The singer rose to worldwide fame in 2015 with his song Sofia.

And on the closing night, Norah Jones will enchant us in História Gardens. The artist has never been to Hungary before and her first concert in Hungary will be given in Veszprém. It's certain to get a packed house, as all tickets for the show are already sold out!

In parallel with the main stage concerts in História Gardens, a special Andrea Rost performance will take place every day from 12th to 15th July at the festival's exclusive concert venue, the Jesuit Church Gardens.

Bagossy Brothers Company celebrates its 10th birthday here; 20-year-old Punnany Massif is preparing an exciting "Valley Special" show, and Carson Coma, Bëlga, Aurevoir will also be with us, plus Blahalouisiana, Bohemian Betyars, Budapest Bar, Csaknekedkislány, Elefánt, Esti Kornél, Irie Maffia, hiperkarma, Margaret Island, Lóci Játsszik and Vad Fruttik.

Cirque du Tókert in Vigántpetend will host Zorán, László Dés and András Kern, as well as the 30-year-old Danubia Orchestra. ON NEW PATHS TO LITERATURE



25th July is the day of Season: this event is the little brother of the winter Off-Season Literary Festival. The 'encore' is a condensed day of exciting activities on the fringes of literature as well as a celebration of meeting the audiences again.

You can even have a picnic while enjoying culture at the literary mini-festival, as most of the activities are open-air for those who love literature, but also for those who think they don't.

Previously, we published two volumes focussing on Lake Balaton in collaboration with POKET, and in 2023 we have arrived to Veszprém—the launch of this third volume is also marks the opening of Season. "Light of the World – Contemporary Writings by Medieval Queens":

We asked our authors to place themselves in the time and thought of the queens. Most of them chose Gizella, but they also brought to life Maria Laskaris and other prominent figures from later eras. The contributors include Eszter Babarczy, poet Zsófia Kemény and university students," says Emese Asztalos, editor of the latest Poket book.

After history and literature, film, music and the visual arts will also be part of the summer of cultural experiences.

"The evening is in the spirit of hip hop. At both Off-Season and Season, we focus on the fringes of contemporary literature. Young people are definitely receptive to literature, but it may not be possible to reach them through conventional channels. Yet, we can make them fall in love with classical literature if we find genres and performers that they feel are relevant to them," explains project manager Richárd Varga.

THE UNIVERSE SINGS



The Symphony of a Thousand to be performed in Veszprém

“Imagine that the whole universe starts to sing, to make music. These are no longer human voices but suns and celestial bodies spinning around each other.”

These were the thoughts Mahler put on paper in a letter about his *Symphony of a Thousand*, premiered in 1910. At 20.00 on 7th July 2023 we will present this great musical masterpiece in Gyárkert (Factory’ard), led by the Hungarian State Opera, with soloists from the city and local and regional choirs.

“Mahler’s *Symphony No. 8* is a work written for one of the largest apparatuses in music literature, but beside its monumental in scale, an equally important feature of the piece is the sublime message that the composer’s music conveys about the redemptive power of love, inspired by a medieval Pentecostal psalm and the concluding thoughts of Goethe’s *Faust*,” says Szilveszter Ókovács, Director General of the Hungarian State Opera.

The opus is a unique experience not only for the audience, but also for the artists.

“In addition to being born in Veszprém, Mária Farkasréti and Gyula Nagy began their studies at Antal Csermák Music School as students of Károly Ötvös, a singing teacher who taught all of us. But I could also mention Szilvia Vörös, who started her career in nearby Ajka and made her way to the Vienna State Opera, or András Palerdi, who has lived in Vászoly since his childhood and returns here after performances in Budapest or even in the USA. These soloists are joined by a row of outstanding singers such as Csilla Boross, Andrea Brassói-Jőrös, Zita Szemere and István Horváth, all graduates of the Veszprém Conservatory. The ensembles of the Opera House, which, if not in the thousands, still number in the hundreds, are also made up of Veszprém choristers and are conducted by Gergely Madaras, another internationally renowned musician and sought-after Hungarian conductor.

I wish from the bottom of my heart that the audience of my hometown will have just as uplifting an experience as we have of performing a cornerstone (capstone?) of European culture each time we play it,”- Szilveszter Ókovács added.

SOUTH BALATON CONTEMPORARY SUMMER



Exhibition, artist in residency and interactive workshops open for everyone

For years, contemporary art has been the main focus of the summer season in Szólád. It is also an opportunity for artists and art enthusiasts to meet in the village, with a series of events over several weeks, including exhibitions and art workshops.



The opening event is an exhibition of the winning works of the 2nd South Lake Balaton School Art Competition and Talent Development Programme and art produced at previous events of the South Lake Balaton Contemporary Art Workshop and Art Residency. Participants will also have the opportunity to see works by famous contemporary artists like Róbert Batykó, Botond Keresztesi, Attila Kondor and Gergő Szinyova.

The South Lake Balaton Contemporary Art Exhibition will be accompanied by lectures and workshops:

- On 22nd July, painter Botond Keresztesi will start from surrealism in his lecture and then move on to artificial intelligence-based imaging

programs, followed by a workshop where you can try out surrealist play and techniques. On 29th July, participants will be introduced to Róbert Batykó and his art, while his workshop will explore contemporary art techniques.

- On 8th August, under the title Birds of Cool, painters Márton Gresca and Dániel Kármán will present collaborative art techniques from guild workshops to 20th century fine art. The talk will be followed by a workshop in which participants will work in small groups to make art together, with communication in the process as important as creativity. It can also be an exciting and self-reflective exercise that could broaden the spectrum of contemplation. On 12th August, painter Gergő Szinyova will explore with participants the issues of materials in making art. During the South Balaton Contemporary Summer, children and their parents are also welcome to participate in creative activities.
- The 6th South Lake Balaton Contemporary Art Workshop and Art Residency takes place from 31st July to 13th August. Every year, the main programme of the Contemporary Summer Programme Series attracts many more applicants than the number that may be accommodated, making it difficult for the jury to select the participating artists. Mentored by painter Gergő Szinyova, the programme will also include open days at Pityang Guesthouse, allowing visitors to get a glimpse of the creative process.
- The final exhibition of the works will open at 15.00 on 12th August and will be celebrated with a light show.

ART INSPIRED BY THE HEART-SHAPED HEADSTONES

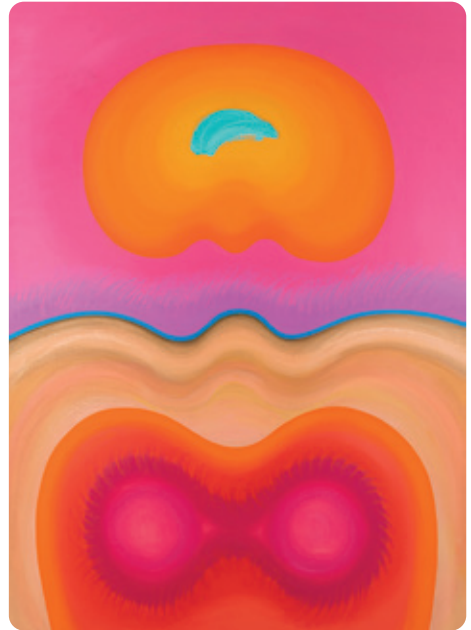
Ilona Keserü, who turns 90 this year, is one of the greatest figures of contemporary art. An exhibition in celebration of her oeuvre is opening in Balatonudvari, next to the heart-shaped gravestones of the cemetery, as her works are largely inspired by these landmark pieces.

This exhibition is one of the jewels in our Barn (Pajta) Programme, and the venue is also special. Anyone can experience art even when getting off their bike, as the public photography exhibition “Keserü 90th” is located right next to the cycle path between the historic cemetery and the football field.

“One of the most important, almost instinctive motifs that fundamentally defined Keserü’s oeuvre was the wave that curves in a large arc in the middle, a form she saw come to life in 1967 on the heart-shaped Baroque gravestones of the Balatonudvari cemetery. Through reproductions of emblematic works selected from the various phases of her career, the exhibition seeks to trace the historical arc of the Keserü universe associated with the gravestone motif from 1967 to the present day,” exhibition curator Mónika Zsikla says, giving an insight into the exhibition’s composition.

Andrea Varga, President of Együtt Balatonudvariért Association, told us that the exhibition features ten double-sided lightboxes displaying Ilona Keserü’s works day and night. Professional facilitator of the outdoor exhibition is MODEM Centre for Modern and Contemporary Art in Debrecen, which presented her oeuvre in 2008.

In connection with the exhibition, art historian Katalin Aknai recently gave several talks on

contemporary painting and Ilona Keserü’s career and art.

Children and adults alike are welcome to four sessions during the summer. Participants can learn about colours, paint, the art of mixing colours and experience the joy of making art through free and simple compositions.

"We will hold masterclasses in all four municipalities: these interactive sessions will be open to all, and at the closing event of the festival, you will be able to listen to a concert by

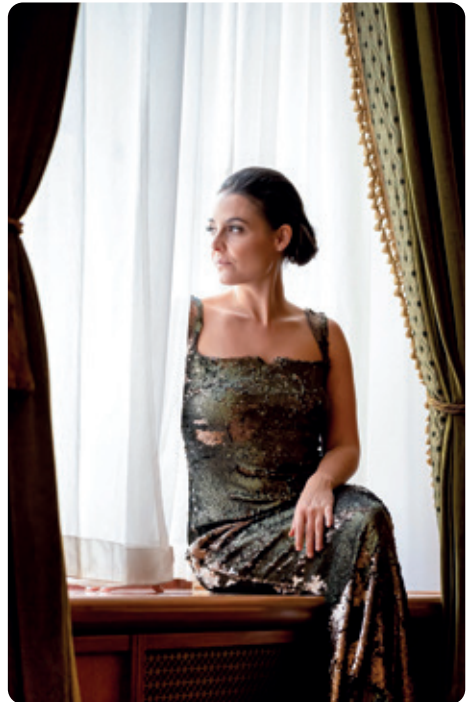

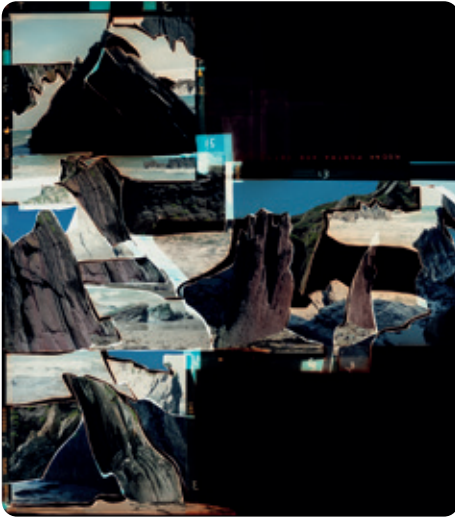

BOGLÁR – HERE AND NOW

Remembering György Galántai's chapel studio in Balatonboglár



György Galántai's chapel studio in Balatonboglár operating between 1968 and 1973 was a key site and institution of 20th century Hungarian art history in many respects.

This year we remember the fiftieth anniversary of the authorities' closure of one of the most important and now one of the best-known venues of the Hungarian neo-avant-garde, where for four years – mainly in summer – almost two hundred artists exhibited their work and a number of accompanying programmes were organised. Many of the works in our exhibition at Vaszary Gallery in Balatonfüred, which is on show until 24th August, are of outstanding importance in the context of the Hungarian and Central and Eastern European art of the 1960s and 1970s, and the history of the studio is a mirror of the relations between power and art in the past.

The exhibition tries to place the history of the Boglár Chapel Studio from its beginnings to its closure and beyond in a cultural and political context that is understandable to younger generations. How did a chapel become a venue for contemporary art under socialism? What form did it take and what did the 3Ts stand for? Who were the banned and who were the tolerated? Equally important, the exhibition aims to reassess the art historical context of the event. Where can the event be placed in the international art context of the time? How was it possible that, for a short period of time, the chapel workshop became a meeting point for artists who never found common ground before or afterwards?

In connection with the exhibition, conjuring up the artistic past will be continued in Balatonboglár from 19th August, when the exhibition "Performative archive" and the related performances will be on show.

HELLO WOOD BUILDER SUMMIT



Extraordinary installations built in the crater of Haláp Hill at the Hello Wood architecture festival

Hello Wood international architectural design festival returns as part of the Veszprém-Balaton 2023 European Capital of Culture programme, bringing together construction-minded students, designers and educators from around the world.

In July, Hello Wood's biggest and most unique event to date is taking place: for eight days, more than 200 international participants will build unique installations in the crater of the Zalahaláp basalt quarry, followed by an exciting two-day music festival. The event will feature performances by international design superstars including Karim Rashid, the Numen collective known for their conceptual space installations, and Arthur Mamou-Mani, an architect credited with the world-famous Burning Man installations. Hello Wood Builder Summit, Europe's largest (future) builder festival, will see the basalt crater of the Haláp come alive from 6th to 15th July, with participants filling the quarry with nearly 20 site-specific temporary installations and land art works, which will be free to explore after the event. There will also be a new Hello Wood installation, a spectacular piece of land art to serve as a central event space.

Builder Summit offers a unique community experience that goes beyond traditional summer camps, inviting participants to adopt a philosophy of "learning by doing" and create and learn together. This year's event will explore the links between intervention and naturalness, demolition and construction, and scarcity and

expansion, to reflect on the ecological conditions of the region and raise awareness of the human-environment-future relationship.

The camp will close with Crater, a two-day music event co-organised by Hello Wood and Kattarzis, known for their popular electronic parties. The exciting DJ lineup will be joined by Hungarian festival favourites and up-and-coming artists from the electronic and hip-hop scene like Analog Balaton, Sisi, Lil Frakk, 6363, Kale Lulugyi and Wavy Budapest. Crater passes and tickets are available at hellowood.eu/krater.

The programme will also play a key role in the long-term recovery of the abandoned Zalahaláp quarry. The installation, which will be used as a stage and central events space during the festival, will be a long-term tourist attraction for the quarry. The rehabilitation of the site is part of the long-term regional development programme of ECoc2023.

PERSONAL BALATON



Nine venues – nine exciting topics about Lake Balaton

What was life like on Lake Balaton in the old days? How did our ancestors live, get culture, have fun and go to the beach in the past decades? Old photos show all this, collected under our Personal Balaton project in cooperation with the Lipták Gábor Town Library of Balatonfüred.

Our programme was launched in 2022: we are researching and collecting stories and people who are willing to share important events in their lives connected to the region, either through photos or personal stories.

Director of Lipták Gábor Town Library Györgyi Tóth told us about the idea behind the project and the research and collection work.

“The library also houses the Local History Collection of Balatonfüred, which has a large collection of postcards and photographs. It is clear that interest in collecting photos on a

community basis has increased in recent years. When we found out that it was possible to join the Veszprém-Balaton 2023 European Capital of Culture programme with a local history project, we decided to apply with a traditional yet modern approach. So we came up with the idea to collect Balaton-themed photo material, not only by uploading it online, but also through personal meetings, so that if someone has a good story or belongs to a generation that doesn't use the internet, they can bring their photo and share their thoughts.” Collection activities are often carried out in partnership, including collaboration with the Hungarian Sailing Federation.

The photos and personal documents will be presented in exciting chamber exhibitions in nine locations around Lake Balaton. In the municipalities participating in the VEB2023 ECFoC programme, we have chosen out-of-the-

ordinary spaces for these exhibitions: a beach, a railway station and a port. In addition to the photos displayed on the exhibition panels, the stories and special memories can be scanned with a mobile code from the Personal Balaton website. The mini-exhibitions will be accompanied by interesting and entertaining programmes at each location, linked to the themes. It is worth following our social pages for information. Györgyi Tóth also told us that among the collected photos there are some subjects that appear frequently.

“In most of the pictures, there is a strong panorama: Lake Balaton, the shores of Lake Balaton or the monadnocks visible in the background. As most of the old photos were taken with film cameras, the photographer had to economise on the number of film frames, so there are many visibly set compositions. What is very interesting is that there were very few photos with a gastronomic theme, for example.”

These collected memories are presented to the public in an innovative way at ports and railway stations along Lake Balaton.

The stories are told in a thematic way through private photos—for example, the Balaton swimsuit fashion, the history of sailing, the winter world of Lake Balaton, the transformation of life in the beach resorts, or the (artistic) journeys of famous writers and poets to the shores of Lake Balaton.

Our first topic in the Personal Balaton programme is sailing on Lake Balaton.

In May, we were looking for personal items and documents related to sailing on Lake Balaton at the entry of the Hungarian Sailing Association's opening race of the year in Balatonfüred. It is a pleasure to see them again at the Personal Balaton Chamber Exhibition on the pier in Füred, on the website and on social media.

It was then that we announced to the public that, in cooperation with our partner the Hungarian Sailing Federation, some of the boats in the L30 OD class will be honouring the European Capital of Culture programme year with special sails over the summer. This was also thanks to another cooperation between students and lecturers of the Faculty of Arts and Creative Industries of the Budapest Metropolitan University and the European Capital of Culture Veszprém-Balaton 2023 programme.

At this year's Balaton sailing competitions, including the prestigious Blue Ribbon, you can admire the artistic canvas designed by METU students billowing by Balaton winds!

SCIENTIFIC EXPERIMENTS – QUALITY PÁLINKA



In addition to our diverse artistic and ecological programmes, we also focus on gastronomy. We support programmes whose owners honour the varied wine and gastronomic traditions of the Bakony and Lake Balaton regions while also placing great emphasis on innovation and professional cooperation.

Such is the case with the July event, which is entitled “An unusual presentation of the varieties of ‘kajszi’ apricots through the eyes of a pálinka judge”. The event is hosted at 10.00 a.m. on 11th July in the Leader House in Balatonalmádi by Csalló Pálinka Manufactory. The event will offer a number of novelties, as participants will be able to discover the results of a variety trial plantation. The professional audience, primarily expert sensory pálinka tasters and representatives of commercial

distilleries, will be able to learn about the varieties of apricots that provide high quality raw material, are planted in larger proportions in Hungarian plantations and are well adapted to the terrain and weather.

Among the varieties, we will also present well-known, less popular and relatively new varieties. The fruit will be “assessed” by the participants on several criteria. The experts will also share their experiences with the public, who will have access to the judges’ reports on the Internet after the event.

In addition to comparing and qualifying pure distillates and their fruit made using different technologies, there will also be a talk on the analytical control of ‘kajszi’ apricot pálinkas, including the organoleptic characteristics of the different compounds, details of the refining process and tests for the protection of origin.

The festival will also feature some of the best wineries in the area, as well as gastronomic exhibitors offering a wide range of delicious wines and dishes.



Sümeg – “Barock” Festival

7th – 9th July

The “Barock” Festival is a fusion of tradition and modernity. Participants will take part in a special journey through time and styles.

The opening performance of the festival, at 14.00 on 7th July, will be a concert by the Szentegyháza Children’s Philharmonic Orchestra, who will be giving several performances. Republic, Lord, Godfater, TRIÁSZ, Roy&Ádám and Takáts Tamás DBB will also be there on the main stage in Szent István Square. Children will be entertained by Réka Farkasházi and Tintanyúl, Csurgó Band and a Barock playhouse.

In addition to music, festival-goers can also immerse themselves in history with a jousting demonstration of Turkish times, fire jugglers as millennia-old magic and light painting as modern-day magic.



Fonyód: Water-Earth-Air Programme Series: Earth

21th – 22nd July

Water, land and air are central to all our lives, yet we often forget to protect and conserve them. Our event will raise awareness of the importance of environmental protection and sustainable living.

After a community volunteer litter picking, participants of a local history walk will learn about the history of Fonyód and the famous Bélatelep villa row. Visitors will also be able to enjoy bird watching and bird ringing, which was previously a great success. The old world of Lake Balaton, the atmosphere of the past decades, will be brought to life with a poster exhibition and a public meeting for the nostalgic and the contemporary generation. The everyday and popular music life will be brought closer to the people through talks by historians. There will also be an exhibition of vintage cars and concerts with Neoton stars, DJ Náksi, Gabi Tóth, and DJ Dominik.

Balatonfüred – Anna Festival

23rd-30th July



Now in its 198th year, one of the country's most important society events, the Anna Ball, the epitome of romance and elegance, is ready to welcome its guests.

The concept of the event, which has been declared a Hungaricum, offers an insight into the history of the celebration steeped in tradition and legend. Over the next three years, participants will be able to travel back in time to the beginning, to 1825, when the first Anna Ball was held in Balatonfüred in the Horváth House in honour of Krisztina Szentgyörgyi-Horváth, who met her future husband, Lieutenant General Ernő Kiss there.

An integral part of the ball is the Opera Festival in Gyógy Square, organised in collaboration with the Hungarian State Opera.

The revival of the traditions of café gypsy music will also play a role. As an innovation, the Hungarian Heritage House is organising a Lead Violinists' Competition, which will feature live music in the district's restaurants, with the best bands being chosen by public vote. The bands will give a nightly concert for the debutantes of Füred as part of the Night of Serenades programme.

The festival will also revive the tradition of heart fishing preserved in the works of Vörösmarty and Krúdy.

INOTA: MUSIC AND LIGHT ART IN THE THERMAL POWER PLANT



Anyone who has driven to Lake Balaton from Budapest will be familiar with the three gigantic cooling towers, whose striking size and shape are embedded in the landscape of Várpalota – symbols of the now defunct Inota Thermal Power Plant, which provided jobs for hundreds of people in its day.

But by the end of summer 2023, thousands of curious people are expected to have come here, and not for work: the first INOTA Festival will run from 31st August to 3rd September, where everyone can find a truly memorable experience. For these four days, the impressive spaces of the industrial complex will be filled with cutting-edge cultural works: more than

100 international and Hungarian electronic musicians, light art and installations that will impress everyone, regardless of age or taste.

And Hungary's first audiovisual festival of its kind will open with an ethereal piano concert in the open air by Nils Frahm, whose live concerts sell out worldwide and whose recordings have won him a string of critical and public accolades and recognition-no wonder, given his unusually intimate connection to the ancient instrument and his timeless alchemy of ambient textures and atmospheric electronics.

The circus performers in this production are also musicians – it is a combination of sounds, melodies and body movements that form the basis of the production.

“Climbing Veszprém” is a tale come to life, where the acrobatics of dance and notes constantly react to each other, punctuated or complemented by the sounds of exotic instruments like the oud, the qanoun, the saz and the darbuka.

The troupe is made up of French artists and led by Eleférios Kechagioglou, a Greek-born performer living in France. The shows so far were highly successful in Bagneux and Gennevilliers, France in 2021, in Eleusis, Greece and in Timisoara in 2022.

RUIN CONCERT – HOMMAGE À PETŐFI



Veszprém and the Balaton Uplands have a singularly rich medieval heritage, as you can find monasteries, churches, chapels and castle ruins everywhere you go in the region. These ruins are filled with life and art in our Ruin Concerts programme.

These events, with a literary and musical focus, aim to create a more personal and intimate connection between performers, audience and environment, as opposed to festivals that attract large crowds. Therefore performances are held with a small audience of 100-150 people at most. Minimising the environmental impact as well as exploring and protecting the values of nature and history are also key elements of the programme, which is why the performances are organised as Zero Waste events.

In the series of Ruin Concerts, at 19.00 on 30th July in Veszprém, at Margaret Ruins, we will have Rozina Pátkai – MINKA x Petőfi. Rozina's project Minka gives an insight into the world of the artist's intermedia experiments. With the help of her fellow musicians, she has found her way back from bossa nova to experimental electronic music and from the Portuguese musical tradition to her own mother tongue. The works of our national poets will be reworked in this musical and literary journey, with Sándor Petőfi as the latest protagonist, commemorating the 200th anniversary of his birth.

This film is special not only because it brings the everyday life of an economic and social crisis close through emotions and stormy love stories, but also because one of the main characters of the Greek film is Hungarian Andrea Osvárt. If you have passed by this work, which is both beautiful and poignant, and which raises questions that are still and increasingly topical today, don't do so now.

KINGSTON (JAMAICA)

What the port city of Kingston, a trading centre of the British Empire and a capital of nearly a million people, has given us can best be told in song. Reggae, which started out in a city slum, is on UNESCO's Intangible Heritage List since 2018 as a spiritual and political genre appealing to emotions and intellect, with stories of the outcast. Bob Marley's and Usain Bolt's home, a city preserving the history of colonial empire and the emancipation of black people, is now a tourist, commercial and financial centre. In mid-summer, Veszprém hosts the Jamaican capital and its treasure, reggae.

The latest option is the Veszprém-Balaton ECoC24 ticket. This ticket is valid for 24 hours and entitles you to unlimited travel on MÁV-START and Volánbus services between the municipalities of the Veszprém-Balaton ECoC region, and is also valid for local transport on

V-Bus vehicles in Veszprém. The price per person is HUF 1990, and can be purchased in MÁVapp, at ticket offices and ticket machines.

If you travel frequently to Veszprém and its region by train or bus, it is also worth taking advantage of the new county or country pass. In fact, Bakony day tickets are now available, which can be used to explore the Veszprém-Győr railway line and the Cuha creek valley as well as the Zirc area by train and bus.

It's not just discounted travel that transport companies offer. Volánbus, MÁV and V-Bus also run night services during special events.

To coincide with the evening events of the programme series, a night relief express train runs to Budapest on Saturdays and public holidays until 28th October. The new service departs from Veszprém at 23.41 after the end of the late evening programmes and offers a

return journey to the capital, Székesfehérvár and the surrounding villages accessible by rail: Hajmáskér, Pétfürdő, Öskü and Várpalota. The train is also connected to the late evening local service of V-Bus.

From 16th June, a new bus timetable starts between Veszprém and Lake Balaton, and from Veszprém to Ajka, Sümeg, Zalaegerszeg, which creates a smoother, more memorable timetable and improves transfers between trains and buses.

FORGOTTEN CRAFTS, CHILDREN'S PLAYHOUSE AND GREAT-GRANDMA'S KITCHEN



In Nochpa Shoft – as the people of Lókút used to say when they popped over to the neighbours. While the adults chatted and told each other short stories from the past, the children could play and “half-listen” to the conversation.

This is the tradition that the events in Lókút as part of the Barn (Pajta) programme are based on. The series of programmes was designed specifically for families: they appeal to all ages, from the little ones to the older generation. People can experience the liberating and recharging power of being part of a community and being creative within it.

In Nochpa Shoft programmes are held every fortnight from autumn to spring on Saturdays from 10am at the Community Forum in Lókút, and during the summer months as part of the Picnic Friday series of outdoor events. Programmes are structured on the basis of three main pillars.

The first is Pike-poka-hai, a playhouse for toddlers where the youngest children can take part in interactive activities, crafts, role-playing games, playful dance lessons and learn songs. The second pillar is called Forgotten Crafts, which will bring back to life the crafts that were once part of everyday life. If you visit these events, you can learn how to hammer straight a scythe, sharpen it, reap, work with a hanzl-pang (Swabian for a traction chair) or even weave a basket. This year, sewing will also be on the agenda: the organisers will combine sewing with local history research to reconstruct and re-sew a folk costume from Lokút. The third pillar, Great-Grandma's Kitchen, invites you into the world of gastronomy. Marica, the housewife of the community kitchen will not only teach the recipes but also household skills and tricks. Everyone's free to join in, so you might see a dad making a doll, a schoolboy working on a traction chair or a two-year-old rolling a noodle.

A fourth pillar is created at the end of the morning events. “We sit around a big table and eat together what we have cooked. That's probably the most important part of the programme, and not because of the lunch, because it's not about feeding the participants. We are here together. We who have made our contributions during the morning all take home a good feeling of satisfaction. In lunchtime conversations, the older people tell stories and the children participate in the storytelling,” mayor Ilona Hegyi Sümegi told about the events held so far.

OUT OF NOSTALGY: COMMUNITY CINEMA



Students bring outdoor community space to life with support from NCF

With an idea for a cinema reminiscent of the old days, the Community-Space-Settlement (KTT) programme team in Kisapáti concluded its almost eight-month community planning process, supported by the National Cultural Fund's Veszprém-Balaton 2023 European Capital of Culture Temporary College.

In the planning process, which started last autumn, students of community organisation, architecture and human ecology first conducted background research, from bus timetables to legends of Szent György Hill, then conducted interviews and went around with questionnaires. Their aim was to get as close as possible to the everyday life of Kisapáti, to understand the stories, memories and challenges of the everyday life of the locals.

How has the village changed over the last decade? For such a small village, what does the charm and growing popularity of Szent György Hill mean? How has the relationship between the village and the hill evolved? With these questions in mind, the KTT team started to organise community discussions in January to start a common reflection on the village's landscape with the young and the elderly, old and new Kisapáti residents alike. The conversations sought to identify public spaces that no longer operate or do not serve the people who live here as they would like, and features that could bring people closer together.

During the search for a space, several options were considered, and the community finally chose the space behind the Community Centre. This space, which is not visible from the main road, is located at the foot of the hill – both practically and symbolically, it is the meeting point between the hill and the village. The choice of the place was made with a view to making it accessible to pensioners, and the elderly people of the village recalled that in their youth it was used as a travelling outdoor cinema, and that from time to time, when the cinema operator came, he would project films onto the wall of the house. It was this nostalgia that drove the design: how great it would be to have a film club again! To watch a film together, to cook, to drink and find a little shade in the summer at Lake Balaton. These were the functions that the students put in order, gave form and material to the project, which was then further analysed with the local community to design a truly open-air community space that responds to the needs of the people who live here and gives it a lovable and understandable form.

Now that the design is finished, the last big step is to build the plans together. The Community Building Week will run from 10th to 15th July, and in addition to the students and their mentors, the residents of Kisapáti are invited to take part in the creation of the space, each according to their own ability, and then in the naming and inauguration ceremony in the evening of the 15th.

TIME TRAVEL: ROAM OLD VESZPRÉM

What was the city like a couple of centuries ago? What were the houses like, what were the streets like, what kind of shops were there, what kind of plants surrounded the people who walked around? Now we can see it all again by using our Map Wanderer app to travel through space and time.

We pick up the mobile phone and in a few moments we are transported back a hundred or two hundred years. This is the interesting time travel that the Map Wanderer offers.

Based on archival documents from the century after 1857, this is an application of great local historical significance. You can choose three specific years: 1857, 1927 and 1947. The archivists and IT specialists have created a lifelike experience by processing cadastral surveys and survey maps, building plans, house registers and digitised contemporary photographs.

“We also know who the owners of the properties were, what features and functions the houses had. We have processed data on around two thousand buildings. These formed the historical core of Veszprém. We have also highlighted about 100 buildings that were particularly important in the life of the town, and we have attached descriptions to them, so we can also learn interesting stories,” said István Boross, Director of the NAH Veszprém County Archives, presenting the Veszprém Map Wanderer.

On the one hand, the application shows how the city’s area increased over time, as many areas were still arable land at the time shown, almost all of which have now become built-up areas. It also shows which buildings were demolished and replaced by new ones, and how the remaining ones have been transformed. These processes are particularly striking in Kossuth Street, where major transformations took place in the second half of the 20th century.

The trail is 8.5 kilometres long and consists of nearly 40 stops between Balatonyörök and Balatonederics. If you are planning to visit Csodabogyós cave in Ederics, it is worth starting your exploration of the trail from here, which not only introduces you to the diverse forest landscape of the surrounding area, but also offers you one of the most beautiful panoramas of the north coast, reaching Szépkitató lookout in Balatonyörök. And who is Old Uncle Pele? He's a nice filber mouse who guides the children along the way, teaching them and the adults a lot of interesting facts.

Red Sandstone Nature Trail

The trail, which tells the history of Balatonalmádi, takes you from the coast to the highest point of Almádi. Legendary buildings, a red stone quarry and the famous locomotive will come into view during the hike, but the most beautiful point is definitely Óvári lookout, from where you can enjoy a wonderful view of the Lake and the town.

Kamon-kő Nature Trail

Starting from the church of Szigliget, the circular tour consists of nine stops and can be walked comfortably in about 2-3 hours while you learn about the history of the village, the one-time volcanoes of Lake Balaton and the local wildlife. You can also discover the most atmospheric little streets of Szigliget, its natural treasures and, last but not least, enjoy the stunning panorama from the top of the hill. In summer, head here for the water surface that sparkles like a diamond, and in autumn for the auburn landscape, the warm lights and the stunning sunsets.

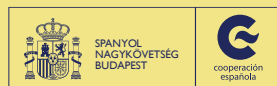
