THE THOUSAND SHADES OF MUSIC

Chaconne Festival Awaits



A festival that aims to raise awareness of the infinite potential of human creativity. A festival where a 16th century genre is given new meaning, and where classical and contemporary go hand in hand.

The Chaconne was originally a characterful dance, often accompanied by mocking lyrics, which appeared in Spain at the end of the 16th century. More recently, it is thought to have originated in the New World, and then, after some digestion, returned to Europe and spread rapidly. Over a few decades, it evolved into a mostly three-beat instrumental genre. It is not really a genre but a musical form that has infiltrated almost every genre, from opera to sacred music and from solo instrumental pieces to orchestral works. Its essence is constancy, the presence of stubborn repetition and change, variation, at the same time. "I've been a fan since I first heard it, and ever since then I've felt that there's something elemental in this otherwise simple form.

The festival has been named 'A Thousand Shades of Music', because the chaconne is so colourful and captivating!" — said ECoC's classical music project manager Pál Vikman, who also spoke about how this style fits in with our times and Veszprém.

"There are many ways of interpreting and explaining our age, but there are still certain striking features. One of them is that it is highly eclectic. The chaconne's 'gene pool' is not exactly poor either: beyond its Spanish and South American ancestors, it is enriched in space by the brilliant colours of all Europe, and in time by hundreds of years. Our aim is to present something that can be called a name: a formula that works well in all types of classical, light, contemporary, sad, selfindulgent or meditative music, in dance, even in literature and in philosophy, without forcing it. It can also be easily linked to Veszprém, as the architecture here is eclectic; but the city's most distinctive and famous buildings were produced in the Baroque period, as was the chaconne."

The festival focuses on the last movement of the violin partita in D minor by J. S. Bach, performed by violinist Márta Ábrahám, who will also give the audience an insightful introduction together with composer Barnabás Dukay.

"Bach exploited the potential of the chaconne form with astonishing creativity, not only in the Partita in D minor, the last movement of which is the Chaconne, but also in the famous Goldberg Variations, which are built on a similar principle. To highlight one piece of magic among many: the basis of the chaconne structure, the aforementioned constancy, is represented by the immediately recognisable, constantly repeated, few-note bass march, which Bach sometimes quite simply leaves out in both works, but in such a way that we involuntarily hear it, imagine it as if it were there," said Pál Vikman describing the music. He went on to talk about some other outstanding concerts.

"It is an exceptional opportunity to see and hear the world-famous Milanese ensemble Il Giardino Armonico in Veszprém. We are also delighted that acclaimed French pianist David Fray has accepted our invitation, and the joint dance performance of Forte Company and the Dador Project, a group of young musicians from Budapest, also promises to be highly interesting."



BRINGING SOUNDS TO LIFE

International Convention of Violin Makers in Veszprém



The melodies are conceived in the hands of instrument makers and brought to life by musicians. The Violin Makers' Convention is thus a fitting pairing for the Chaconne Festival.

Veszprém is not only European Capital of Culture, it is also a City of Music, as it was awarded this prestigious title by UNESCO in 2019. In addition to our classical and popular music festivals, we also aim to showcase the birth of the instruments at the international convention for violin makers this October.

The city hosted an international professional meeting in 2012 already, with Master Gio Batta Morassi as the guest of honour. The Master's son Simeone Morassi has graciously agreed to be the guest of honour at this year's meeting.

The International Convention of Violin Makers is not only a forum for professionals, but also an event for music enthusiasts. The master craftsmen exchange professional ideas and the public can admire the instruments made by the participants. The atmosphere of the Archbishop's Palace and its 18th-19th century furniture are a fitting complement to the beauty of these old instruments. But the violins will not only be a sight to behold, they will also be played – and in a very special way.

"There will also be a violin sound competition: an artist will play the instruments behind a screen and visitors can vote for their favourite sound. The winning violin will be played by Philip Zuckerman at the Bach concert in the evening," Elemér Sümegi, master violin maker from Veszprém and organiser of the event explains.



Visitors to the meeting will also experience that master violin makers have a lot to be skilled at. They need a musical ear, a talent for drawing, precision, knowledge of working with materials and, of course, the physical activity required for the craft.

"It's a creative art that takes months of work before the instrument is finished. You can't learn everything; a lot of things require aptitude. The first step is to draw the lines of the instrument as a whole, which requires drawing skills. Our musical talents are best used when we tune, carve, plane the wood and hear the right resonance from this treasure of nature. Carving a scroll also requires dexterity.

The form was born back in the Baroque, the design has remained almost unchanged since then and we work with almost the same tools as then.

The making of the instrument has also remained human-scale. Something happens in the process of creation, and the music reflects the beauty of the past and of handicraft," says Elemér Sümegi, hoping that visitors to the event will also get a feel for this.

Or where is humanity heading?



In celebration of Imre Madách's 200th birthday, the Veszprém-Balaton 2023 European Capital of Culture programme is preparing a special festival to take the author, his most famous work and the thoughts of the participants out of that certain box.

The Festival of Thought is based on Imre Madách's The Tragedy of Man, but it does not explore the text from the usual approaches – i.e. primarily not from a literary or literary-historical perspective – but rather examines the topicality of the themes, ideas, questions and problems contained in the work.

Thus, sociological, economic, ecological, psychological and other scientific themes will be the main topics of the five-day event. Creation, eternal life, climate change, posthumanism, democracy, the future of capitalism and money, dreams, relationship dynamics, burn-out, the relationship between the self and the community, astronomy, mathematics, artificial intelligence, Central Europe, the concept of Eurasia, alcohol, cloning, consumer society, trust, the future: just some of the themes that will be explored at the festival.

The programme includes a wide range of formats, including some that are less common in Hungary.

Another important aim of the Madách200 – Festival of Thought is to bring together Hungarian and international experts from a variety of backgrounds, with different

perspectives, to discuss the given topic. This would bring together clerics of various faiths, followers of diverse scientific discourses, and representatives of a range of economic, philosophical or political schools.

Structurally, the festival focuses on the 15 scenes from The Tragedy of Man, with three scenes per day. The afternoon and early evening sessions are a time for round-table discussions, talks and debates, while the evening is devoted to artistic performances related to the scenes. Egyptian, Greek, Czech and French orchestras, vocal ensembles, contemporary drama performances and gastronomic events add to the intellectual programme.

"The rise of the 'white gold' of Europe: porcelain dates back to the Baroque period, and this style is therefore found in the early works of art of all the exhibiting manufactories. The changes in period styles are characteristically represented in the later works, which take us through the trends of Classicism, Louis Seize, Biedermeier, Art Nouveau and Art Deco to the latest endeavours in contemporary design. Various porcelain works can be seen side by side, including decorative objects, figurines, tableware, bravura pieces and pattern treasures," dr. Attila Simon explains in introducing the exhibition entitled Porcelain Constellations.

Herend Porcelain Manufactory presents the unique evolution of its most iconic and globally popular pattern, the Victoria pattern, over 172 years, from the classic gold medal-winning design of the 1851 London Great Exhibition to the modern day. The 'scaly fishnet' has also enjoyed a worldwide career, and has seen many developments in recent years, from classical to platinum turquoise and trendy cool-coloured versions that appeal to young people.

"The Herend exhibition section presents a colourful collection ranging from the most traditional pieces of the artisan tradition to the



latest in luxury porcelain, dreamed up with the intention of creating a style in porcelain. Herend has strong traditional roots, but also fresh, innovative drives, so we also showcase contemporary works of art that reflect our ability to constantly innovate," dr. Attila Simon reveals.

MUSIC OF INEXPLICABLE ORIGINS

Since the early 1960s, German artist Sigmar Polke was preoccupied with the relationship between reality and visual reality, i.e. art and everyday life.

He often adopted a detached and ironic stance, which allowed him to focus on the form and material nature of painting, in addition to the content. His wide-ranging oeuvre includes paintings, works on paper, photography, film, objects and graphics. His art is characterised by an unusual and experimental use of a variety of media and materials and a rich pictorial world. His favourite technique is water gouache, a method of painting that thematises the dripping and flowing of paint, the controlled and uncontrolled occurrence of physical phenomena. To contrast the unpredictability of the flowing trail of paint, the artist quite characteristically places a regular, predictable grid system on the surface as a counterpoint.

The fact that Polke gave the pictures absurdsounding titles, which also lend a poetic tone to the images, is testament to his art.

THE COLOURS OF THE BAKONY – ONE EXHIBITION, IN MANY WAYS

Our Magyarpolány CultNet Base delights audiences with contemporary art – in unusual ways. Special works await the audience in a variety of unconventional venues.

"Art is not what it is, it is something else" – in the spirit of this motto, the artists of our CultNet Base in Magyarpolány have in recent months worked in several workshops, at international art retreats, action painting and a thematic steel sculpture workshop. We are giving substance to this otherness by creating new connections with the public in the fields of printmaking, painting and sculpture. The works are presented in three ways: the first is a street art exhibition.

"With the outdoor exhibition we would like to bring the works closer to the public. We chose the title "Colours of the Bakony" on the one hand because it is autumn and the world is getting more and more colourful, and on the other hand the theme itself is very colourful, as it presents a variety of art genres. Both venue and the works are also highly innovative. In a traditional art retreat, everyone does their own work: we have stepped out of this creative process. In the fields of painting and sculpture, not only individual works were created, but the artists also produced a work together," said graphic artist Tibor Csabai, the main organiser of the Magyarpolány CultNet Base.

The works will then also be available to view online, in the setting of the Krypton Factory in Ajka, and then in real life at the Krypton Factory.

The world's first Krypton Factory – a former industrial plant closely linked to the lives of the people of Ajka and a key part of the city's identity – was given a new function earlier this year: it has become a cultural and community



space with support from our infrastructure development programme.

The opening of the exhibition there will be accompanied by musical performances based on the sounds recorded by the artists during the metal sculpting action.

Further Improvements in Veszprém City Centre



Under the Veszprém-Balaton 2023 European Capital of Culture programme, several hospitality establishments have opened in the centre of Veszprém in recent years, which have revitalised the area around the Old Town Square and the city's everyday life.

Through the Street Management Programme, businesses have been given the opportunity to get involved in the everyday life of Veszprém, helping to create and build communities over a glass of wine, a cup of coffee or a delicious lunch.

The first step of the programme was the opening of Papírkutya (Paper Dog) Culture Bistro in 2020, which has since become one of the favourite places of the people of Veszprém and visitors - and not by chance. In May 2021, Füge Ice Cream Yard and Café brought the

best ice cream to the city centre. KUNSZT was launched that autumn and is not only a café, but also a design shop and community space, filled with a wide range of cultural programmes, workshops and family fun options.

Then Wine & Vinvl wine bar opened, where the best vinyl records spin alongside a wide selection of wine, followed by Pekedli General Grocery Store, where you can buy products from local and regional producers, but you can also sit down for bread and lard or a quick coffee.

In 2022 and the ECoC year, the list of places continued to grow. Saiko no Sushi opened in the autumn of 2022 in the heart of the city centre at 24 Old Town Square – to bring a new colour to the gastropalette of the City of Queens. Japanese specialities, sushi, hungry diners, but of course culture and community building are



all on the menu, which can be sampled in the form of periodic programmes at the restaurant. In March this year, Kossuth Street gained a new venue: Mimosa Café & Bar, where you can enjoy a coffee or a cocktail. And for vegetarian and vegan eaters, Ablak a bablak restaurant and community space in Rákóczi Street has been serving delicious vegan and vegetarian delicacies every day since July. This summer, legendary restaurant Lohonyay Vendéglő in Veszprém, whose history dates back to the beginning of the 20th century, also reopened.

The Street Management Programme has not only created new places, but also supported the development of existing successful cafés and restaurants, including the cult Óváros Vendéglő, Bárka, Skorpió Pub and Terem Bar, Expresszó, Oliva Restaurant and Chill Bistro.

Valley Interrogation in the Balaton Uplands

As part of CultNet VEB2023, Forte Company traces the life's work of dr. Tivadar Józsa, the legendary GP of the Balaton Uplands, who was active as a writer, sociographer and art collector under the name György Bodosi.

What does it mean to be an artist and a citizen in a provincial environment? Is it possible to break into the world of high culture from there? And perhaps most importantly, what does it mean to be committed to the culture of a small local community?

Forte Company, known for its distinctive physical theatrical language, sought to answer these questions when it set out to explore the life of Bodosi. Bodosi worked in all genres. In addition

to poetry, he wrote excellent sociographies, prose and drama, publicism, patient diaries, reports, prose verse, travel journals, a landscape novels and a family history. These are processed in various forms by Forte Company.

"György Bodosi's oeuvre draws from the local, formulates universally and aims for the universal" — says Csaba Horváth, director-choreographer and head of Forte, who himself has ties to Pécsely.

After the highly successful premiere in Pécsely, the performance in Veszprém will convey the values of the place and the theatre initiation programme to theatre-loving audiences in Veszprém.


In fact, Private Veszprém is about presenting the city's past not through official sources, but through people's personal stories, photos, old shop windows and legends of the city," project leader and media artist Dávid Szauder explains.

Ms Hajnalka Vörös Márkus adds that the VEB2023 ECoC gives priority to programmes related to personal history.

"The Private Veszprém and Private Lake Balaton projects are part of the Memory Map theme and are linked to several similar projects organised by the VEB2023 ECoC. The Veszprém County Archives of the National Archives of Hungary have a project called Map Wanderer, which aims to present the history of the town to locals and visitors through the story of a house and its inhabitants in a 150-year time section. The Street Management Programme was also designed to bring new content to long-vacant shops with a series of short films showing what the walls of the city centre tell us about."

The project is also aimed at visitors from other countries and abroad, who can learn about the history of the city through the installations, even while walking along the streets.

One of our flagship projects is called Shopfronts Revisited, which will see five redesigned shop windows around the city. The first is the Rosenberg shopwindow.

"We can see the wonderful building of KUNSZT, but do we know who Jenő Rosenberg really was, who built one of the loveliest houses of Veszprém? Did we know that he stopped the Spanish flu and provided free care to the poor in his own clinic? Unfortunately, we hadn't had a photo of him but we've just found one, so we know what he looked like and we want to tell his story through a reimagined shopwindow," Dávid says. In another storefront, passers-by may encounter a lesser-known name from Veszprém, who is none other than Károly Francsics, whose name is preserved by a small street near Óváros tér (Old Town Square).

"Károly Francsics was a master barber who had his workshop in the city in the 1840s, which unfortunately went bankrupt, leaving Francsics in poverty. What we should know about him is that he had an incredible hobby: he kept a diary and wrote down everything he saw. This diary has survived, and in it, Francsics told the story from his own perspective of what happened on March 15th 1848. We pay tribute to his memory by reimagining one of the vacant shopwindows, which we fill with memories of his life."

Special 3D-printed statues also evoke the prominent figures of Veszprém's past.

"We have selected five important individuals whose statues we will create and exhibit throughout the year. One of these is the statue of the above mentioned Károly Francsics, which will be placed next to his former barbershop. He may not have been a famous painter or writer, but he contributed to the history of Veszprém by documenting it in his diary. In our eyes, he is a true hero deserving of a statue," Dávid says.

One of the highlighted elements of our Private Veszprém project is the compillation of a carefully selected photo collection. The organisers searched for private and institutionally collected photos in the archives and other available sources and also sought the help of locals.

"To get to know the city, we need to involve the local residents so that they want to be part of this collective thinking and contribute their own photos to this special photo and memory collection. The presence of families is the best way to measure a city's development, so these memories are particularly important," Dávid explains.

The most prominent and long-lasting elements of the project will be "Storytelling Bus Stops," which are being realised in collaboration with the Local History Association.

"The city is constantly changing; buildings are being demolished, new structures and areas are being created, and we are interested in how we can commemorate those buildings, spaces, and the people associated with them, even if they are no longer present," says Dávid. "The 'Storytelling Bus Stops' are especially important because the shopwindows and statues are mainly located in the city centre, around the Old Town Square and Kossuth Street, while the stops are scattered throughout the entire city, covering a total of 30 points, encompassing the entire city. We took particular care to include photos of families or individuals who lived in the respective areas," we learned from Hajnalka, who also adds that through the families' stories, we will find out what these individuals were involved in.

Interested individuals can learn more about the families, the project, and the activities of VEB2023 ECoC through QR codes.

Our goal is for the project not to focus only on this year but to bring long-term results. We want the archive created from the photos to endure in the future, which people can not only look at but also continue to enrich.

"We hope that a sort of dialogue will develop among people because everyone has their own memories of these locations, which can create a strong connection. Thus, the entire process creates incredible value." says Dávid.

According to Hajnalka, the foundation for the long-term operation of the project is not

only the statues and installations but also the collective memory that has emerged as a result of the project.

"This type of personal photo and memory collection was started by the Museum and the Archives ten years ago, so the project has a history, and we hope it will have a future as well. We hope that families will continue thinking that it is important to share their personal memories with public collections. Unfortunately, I often observe that – especially among young people – they think that history happens somewhere else, say, in the capital, when in fact, history is happening right now, in the events unfolding in the lives and decisions of families living in Veszprém. We are part of it, and our every action, thought, and creativity greatly influence the events of the country or the region. This is the foundation of the Private Veszprém project, which, with Dávid's help, is being realised in a unique visual form on a European and modern scale."

The event is proof that we must learn from each other wherever we are in the world, because that is the only way to develop, grow, and become rich and complete in knowledge.

On the one hand, we have tried to arrange the schedule so that the competitors have more time and more opportunity to consult the seven-member international jury, ask for guidance and opinions. Another important innovation is that we have chosen works by Hungarian composers as the mandatory pieces for age groups IV-V. In addition to works by Zoltán Kodály and Sándor Szokolav, the contestants will have to play works by contemporary composers Péter Tóth and János Vajda. Our aim is to get as many people as possible to play and love these pieces so that they can get better acquainted with 20th and 21st century Hungarian composers and our culture.

The aim of the gala concert is both to showcase the skills of young talent and strengthen links between young people from across the world.



TROUBLED WATERS – A DIALOGUE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT







Water, living space, future – these are also key words at Balatorium. In the autumn, we will be presenting this project in a special exhibition. The focus is on cooperation and dialogue between project participants.

Our Balatorium project initiates a dialogue about the ecological system and values of Lake Balaton through cultural and artistic projects. The aim of our exhibition 'Troubled Waters' is to present our research, experiences and achievements in the light of these collaborations and dialogues.

Among the collaborations, it is particularly important that the artists have established close links with researchers working in the region, including the Tihany-based Limnological

Research Institute, the Limnological Research Group of the University of Pannonia in Veszprém and the staff of the Balaton Uplands National Park. The exhibition, curated by Borbála Soós, presents a wide range of projects, including works developed in the two Artist-in-Residence Programmes, workshops from the two Ecological Weeks, a series of performative Slow Landscape Walks, and interactive public interventions, projects developed by students of the Moholy-Nagy University of Art and Design, publications collected in the ever-expanding beach library, and an outdoor installation in the museum's courtyard, made from reeds harvested on Lake Balaton.

The exhibition highlights three main strands of our Balatorium project.



The discourse around bodies of water explores how water connects different places and bodies, including plants, animals and humans at molecular, regional and global scales. Paying attention to this embodied circulatory system helps us understand that we are all intimately linked through water, which connects us to other bodies in space and time.

We also ask how we imagine the landscapes of the future and what stories we choose to tell. Whose imagination are we going to live in? The theme includes ecological, political and social aspects, such as thinking about the often conflicting interests and desires of human and non-human users of the lake. Who has access to the lake and under what conditions? Who is welcome and who is not? Who is useful and who is not?

The third strand of the exhibition is Slow Walk, a performative Slow Walk through the Landscape, which focuses on noticing the small things and how to establish and maintain a personal connection with a particular place.

Visitors are encouraged to pick up cards and books and smell, taste and listen to the various elements of the exhibition.

NEARLY THIRTEEN BILLION FORINTS FOR CULTURAL LIFE

This year, the National Cultural Fund of Hungary (NCFH) is spending almost 13 billion HUF to support culture in Hungary through its calls.



"Cultural life is facing unprecedented challenges, as is the case for the whole country, and in this situation it is particularly important that the National Cultural Fund is a firm support for cultural operators. After 9 billion HUF for the programmes announced last year but to be implemented this year, through the Hungarian Genius Programme and the Petőfi 200 Temporary College programmes, our artists could spend a further 4 billion HUF on the realisation of their works and programmes in the summer, in the tenders that were widely anticipated in the Hungarian art scene", said Balázs Bús, Vice President of NCF, adding that the payment of the grants awarded earlier has also been completed.

The Fund, which is financed from royalties and 90 percent of the lottery's gaming tax, launched a call to support cultural festivals in the summer, and the relevant college awarded more than 330 million HUF.

Following the call from the College of Cultural Festivals, the Fund has launched a call for folk and fine arts, for the arts and crafts, community culture, and for musicians under the Hangfoglaló Programme. This year, the College of Libraries and Archives is again launching a call to support the distribution of periodicals to libraries.







GYUMRI

Armenia's second largest city, Gyumri bears the country's troubled history and cultural richness in a small way. At 1509 metres above sea level, Gyumri has been a Russian military centre, a refuge from Armenian genocide, bearing the names Alexandrapol and Leninakan. Nothing better evokes the spirit of the Caucasus, the hardened identity of Armenians in history and the tragic beauty of their fate than the sound of the emblematic instrument, the duduk. Gevorg Dabaghyan's concert by InterUrban features this instrument, a UNESCO Intangible Heritage item. Pianist Lusine Grigoryan, an internationally renowned interpreter of the greatest Armenian composer Komitas and Béla Bartók, is coming to Veszprém, bringing with her a more intimate layer of Armenian culture. There are some things that music conveys best, even in a culture as strongly rooted in literacy as Armenian culture. Proof of this is the wonderful music that comes to Veszprém through the InterUrban programme.

Lusine Grigoryan Concert

Renowned pianist Lusine Grigoryan is a native of Gyumri, but her sophisticated performance and insightful interpretations have captivated audiences around the world.

She is a celebrated interpreter of Komitas, the greatest Armenian composer, as evidenced by the release of Komitas: Seven Songs under Germany's prestigious ECM label. She is close to composers of the folk music tradition, like Béla Bartók and Komitas, and her style is "characterised by an eternal calmness, free of superfluous colour and emotion". Perhaps like the serenity of the mountains surrounding her hometown. In Lusine Grigoryan's concert at Hangvilla, the universal language of classical music also reveals a little about Armenian culture.

TARTU

Tartu is the oldest city in the Baltic region, the cultural capital of Estonia, home to the first Estonian university and the first Estonian Song Festival. The former Hanseatic city, with its university, has always been an important intellectual centre in the region and retained its identity whether it was ruled by Germans, Swedes, Russians or Poles. It boasts an atmospheric historic townscape and a unique ambience, imbued with closeness to nature and playfulness: the Estonian hallmark. Speaking of national characters, Tartu hosted the first Song Festival in 1869, coinciding with the emergence of national consciousness. How Estonian identity is intertwined with music and song is also demonstrated by the events of the Singing Revolution – the four-year wave of protests that swept across the Baltic and led to the region's independence. It's worth listening to the Estonian bands that InterUrban Tartu brings to Veszprém for two weeks.

Folklore Music Workshop

Growing up in a family of musicians, Silver Sepp has been singing since childhood, and brings this joy and naturality to his work as a musician and teacher. Guests of the workshop get an up-close look at the Estonian singing tradition, which dates back to mythical times and is a living heritage in Sepp's seafaring family. We can get a feel for the rhythm of the Kalevala poem, the beauty of the Estonian language and sing together like we did around the fire thousands of years ago.







EGRY INSPIRATIONS



How much of an extraordinary artist's impact is felt 140 years on?

Until the end of October, the József Egry 140 exhibition is on display at Laczkó Dezső Museum in Veszprém. In our interview, we ask what influence József Egry has had on the renowned art collectors of our time and which works of art are on loan for the exhibition.

András Szabó, owner of ResoArt Salon, has lent nine paintings to Laczkó Dezső Museum's exhibition Egry 140.

József Egry's main subject was the Balaton landscape. What first comes to your mind when you look at Egry's paintings of the lake? That it has a thousand faces and colours! From the brilliant light of the Golden Bridge of sunshine or the rainbow to the indigo blue of the stormy waters. While the fishing boats have disappeared from the lake, the sailboats that often appear in Egry's pictures have taken over the waters.

IF YOU HAD TO USE ONE WORD OR PHRASE TO DESCRIBE JÓZSEF EGRY'S ART, WHAT WOULD IT BE AND WHY?

Unity of man and nature. For him, man and the man-made environment always blend harmoniously into the landscape. His figures almost never express strong emotions; they perform the activities they are shown with a resignation to their 'destiny', being part of something greater.

WHICH PAINTINGS HAVE YOU CONTRIBUTED TO THE EXHIBITION?

Nine of the more than forty pieces in our collection of József Egry's paintings have been loaned to Laczkó Dezső Museum. Perhaps the best known of these is the painting entitled 'Mirage, Hazy Lights', which is one of the first summaries of the new theme of Lake Balaton and the new technique of oil pastel. Together with my partner Magdolna Költő, our most beloved painting is Sunset, also known as



Golden Bridge, which we call "the universe expressed with an absence of means".

THE NAME OF JÓZSEF EGRY IS FIRMLY LINKED TO BADACSONY. DO YOU HAVE A FAVOURITE PLACE AT LAKE BALATON? DO YOU HAVE A PERSONAL CONNECTION TO THE LAKE AND ITS SURROUNDINGS?

My partner urged us to add József Egry's works to our collection, while I preferred the ones from Nagybánya. But the windows of our house in Tihany overlook the water, facing the rising summer sun, and so the Golden Bridge has become a personal experience for me too! There, the rainbow after the rain, the sight of the mist rising from the hills of Füred and the sun's rays breaking through it, made me understand the greatness of Egry's painting, and we started to buy his paintings. I understood and felt that Egry was not really painting the landscape but its soul, as he himself once said: "I don't paint Lake Balaton, but its world."

A powerful voice and an intense guitar style – Danish Mike Andersen gives three concerts at Papírkutya.

At the age of twelve, Danish Mike Andersen was already captivated by blues, soul and r'n'b. While his contemporaries were listening to Madonna and Duran Duran, he was collecting records by B.B. King, Muddy Waters, John Lee Hooker, Al Green and Marvin Gaye. Decades later, now with a successful band (Mike Andersen Band) behind him, he suddenly embarked on a solo career, wanting to write songs stripped down to just the vocals, with acoustic guitar accompaniment only.

With a powerful and sensitive voice and an intense guitar style, Mike's first solo album proved successful enough for him to leave his band behind for a while and tour solo. But he does occasionally return to his band.

Encounters in Music City – Mátyás Pribojszki and Bassekou Kouyate – Amy Sacko

Amy Sacko too has Jeli ancestry and is known as Mali's Tina Turner because of her

distinctive voice. Mátyás Pribojszki also handles his instrument with amazing expressiveness, while always returning to the blues, of which he is an internationally renowned player.




LISTEN TO LAKE BALATON!





The Sound of Lake Balaton album has arrived



Close your eyes and imagine yourself standing on the shores of Lake Balaton. What do you hear? The rushing of the water? The rustling of the reeds, the sound of ducks passing nearby, or the summer buzz from the beach? This was the idea that inspired the members of the BALATORIUM team to create a special album of ten songs, the Balatorium album entitled 'The Sound of Lake Balaton', with the help of prominent representatives of the Hungarian popular music scene. We asked Kamau Makumi, a key member of the project, for more details.

For those familiar with the Hungarian music scene, the name Kamau Makumi definitely rings a bell: not only is he the frontman of the band Mary Popkids, he is also a composer, producer, foun-der of Banana Records and the main organiser of the La Boum festival.

HOW WAS THE IDEA OF THE SOUND OF LAKE BALATON ALBUM CONCEIVED?

Can Togay and the BALATORIUM team approached me as the head of Banana Records to intro-duce us to the essence of the BALATORIUM project and came up with the idea of creating a mu-sic album for this ecological and educational programme. We were given a free hand in the pro-ject, from the very beginning, everyone agreed that we did not want an album of mainstream pop songs because that would not fit in with the concept of ecology, we wanted to do was to bring to-gether the highlights and curiosities of the Hungarian music scene, the indie-electronic scene, who already operate on the fringes of experimentation. That's how we ended up inviting the ten artists who are featured on the album, and we had an open call for one slot.

WHAT DO WE KNOW ABOUT THE CREATIVE PROCESS? HOW LONG DID IT TAKE TO MAKE THE ALBUM?

The process started with a talk given by the PAD Foundation to the musicians involved, in which the ecology of Lake Balaton was presented. This was step zero, a sort of inspiration gathering, and Analog Balaton spent two days recording sounds and atmospheres around the lake, resulting in a sample pack of 50 sound files. These were given to the performers to use in their music. The al-bum was finished by the end of spring, and everyone had about three months to make their own songs, and we also recorded video sessions with three bands around Lake Balaton. The album la-unch was in mid-August at Bánya Gardens in Salföld.

HOW WAS THE LAUNCH? HOW WAS THE ALBUM RECEIVED?

It was great, almost sold out. Five out of the eleven bands on the album performed at the venue, and they perfectly evoked the atmosphere of the album. In addition to the performers, the PAD Foundation gave a presentation, and a Szabadonbalaton bar was set up, where you could taste Ba-laton-inspired food and drinks made from algae and specialities. So we had a lot of interesting things in store, and the event perfectly conveyed how music and the ecology of Lake Balaton can be linked.

AS A MUSICIAN, HAVE YOU EVER FOUND YOURSELF INSPIRED BY LAKE BALATON? WERE YOU INSPIRED BY THE LAKE WHILE MAKING THE ALBUM?

Absolutely! I learned a lot of interesting things from the presentations, including how everything is interconnected in this big

ecosystem, of which we only know a fraction For me, it was very helpful to be made aware that these are not separate entities, but that each part of the whole region has an impact on the others.

YOU MENTIONED THAT YOU RECORDED SEVERAL SOUNDS AROUND LAKE BALATON. WHAT IS THE FIRST SO-UND THAT RINGS IN YOUR EARS WHEN I SAY LAKE BALATON?

"The sound of a lawnmower roaring in the distance. You get up in the morning and somewhe-re they're always mowing the grass around the lake. For me, this is the sound of Lake Balaton, or when you hear the children shouting on the beach from far away, the buzzing and hustle and bustle brings me the Balaton atmosphere. Recently I've been spending a lot of time in the Kál basin, which doesn't exactly evoke the beach atmosphere and sounds, but rather the wind-sound of looking at the hills, which I also really like."

YOU TALK ABOUT THE LAKE AS IF YOU KNOW IT VERY WELL. DO YOU HAVE A PERSONAL CONNECTION TO IT?

Of course: my grandparents have a holiday home in Balatonszéplak-felső, so I spent my summers there from childhood, and I met many of my friends there. Some of my band mates are from Mar-cali and Keszthely, so I spent a lot of time in those places too, and in recent years I fell in love with the already mantioned Kál basin, especially the area around Szentbékkálla. I also love Vesz-prém for the Street Music Festival, the atmosphere of the city and the locals.

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













